We chose the Italian architect's 'Theatre of the World' as our teaching resource.

The reason was that according to the news at that time, Italy had the highest number of COVID-19 victims in the world. Venice, Italy, has just recovered from flooding caused by the 2019 storm and storm surge.

And the carnival, which was held to celebrate the revival, was also interrupted. It was with 'Go Venice!' in mind that I decided on this material.

"This architecture is on a ship. The next port of anchorage is your home. Please build it with care and let it dock permanently on your shelf."

For this project, we have prepared drawings and materials to encourage more interest in architecture, rather than simply enjoying building architectural models at home.


The completed work should be photographed and sent by email. We critique the work and reply to you. The deadline for submissions is until the end of the temporary school closure.







Night scene work on the sea, with LED lighting installed.
