For instance, levees and canals are built to protect the town areas by elevating the living typology above the water during the flood season, etc. However, due to rapid climate change, our planet earth encounters more severe disasters causing an increasing amount of lives lost and endless difficulties that are more significant than the past. Within recent years, there have been large scale floods in Australia, United States, Thailand, England, this points out that the living conditions in the delta lands are ever unstable. Town planning/architectural design/interior space from the past are simply perished and soon to be obsolete.

In the delta areas where the lands are low and the crossing water ways are highly uncontrollable, should we search for new living typologies that allow us to survive the destructive disaster? As an architect, should we come up with a new and sustain way to deal with the abundance and the scarcity of water?

In search of sharp vision for a better living with water in the future, The Association of Siamese Architects (ASA) calls for international design proposals for tomorrow's living typologies for unstable delta areas. The competition is highly conceptual thus there is no requirement for a specific site. Furthermore, we are focusing on smart actions of new architecture/space proposed for the different condition of the world we will live in tomorrow.

Conditions of Entry:

1. The competition is opened to everyone, including foreigners.
2. Each applicant may submit one or more projects for selection and on short listing/selection.
3. All entry submissions should have legal rights and copyrights to all the material submitted. If the projects contains any material or elements that are not owned by the entrant, the submissions shall be excluded from any consideration.
4. The copyright of the project belongs to the submitter.
5. All material submitted may be displayed or published at the discretion of the Association of Siamese Architects under Royal Patronage.
6. All damages that occur during shipping and transport will be responses by the entrant.

Submission Requirement:

1. There is no restriction on the medium, colors or techniques use for the presentation.
2. The text should be a short description of the project and what its aims are. It should not be more than 150 words in length.
3. All written material shall be in Thai or English language only.
4. Each sheet shall be used in an upright position and limited to maximum 2 (two) sheets of A1 (594x840 mm) size on a stiff, light mounted, not more than 2 cm. thick.
5. Each sheet shall be numbered in consecutive Arabic numerals and provided with a project ID. Each ID should contain 3 uppercase characters and 4 digits in English (ex. ASA1234). The character and number should be 1" high and placed at the bottom right on the obverse side of each sheet.
6. All participants should submit a separate of A4 size paper containing the participant's real name, age, address and contact number along with a certified copied of identification and a CD enclosed in a sealed envelope with the project code on the bottom left of the envelope. The CD should content all of the drawings, photographs and text in JPEG format at 720 dpi RGB with the total package size shall not exceed 2.5Mb per entry. The envelope should be pasted on the obverse side of each sheet
